

ORDINANCE NO. 76

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BARRETT, MONROE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORIES, AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS AND OTHER STRUCTURES, THEIR CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, EXTENSION, REPAIR, MAINTENANCE, AND ALL FACILITIES IN OR ABOUT SUCH BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES, THE PERCENTAGE OF LOT THAT MAY BE OCCUPIED, THE SIZE, DEPTH AND WIDTH OF YARDS AND OTHER OPEN SPACES, THE DENSITY OF POPULATION, AND THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND LAND FOR TRADE, MANUFACTURING, RESIDENCE OR OTHER PURPOSES; ESTABLISHING DISTRICTS AND THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF FOR SAID PURPOSES; PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A ZONING HEARING BOARD AND SETTING FORTH THE DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF SAID BOARD; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Barrett Township, Monroe County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Authority of the same:

SECTION 1. The amended Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Barrett, Monroe County, Pennsylvania, dated November 6, 1978, together with the Zoning Map of Barrett Township dated July 1978, is hereby adopted as the Barrett Township Zoning Ordinance, *as corrected.*

SECTION 2. A true and correct copy of the aforesaid amended Zoning Ordinance and the said Zoning Map is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.


